Comments: Butterfly activity diminished substantially mid to late afternoon during episodes of heavy overcast and rain showers. Common Milkweed abundant and at peak bloom in most locations. Remarkable hatch of Black Dash from one site, and high numbers of Pearl Crescents, Clouded Sulphurs, Common Wood-Nymph, and Silver-spotted Skippers. Meadow Fritillary was well-represented, Monarchs were scarce in all but one location, and Baltimore Checkerspots were absent or observed in very low numbers at traditionally productive sites. Totals: 44 species and 1,840 individuals (adults and immatures).
